RANGE LEASING IN SIGHT.

In the Oregonians' editorial published elsewhere in this issue of The Examiner, Gifford Pinchot is given praise for having "secured the adherence of the stockmen to the policy of leasing the government ranges." Whatever persuasiveness Mr. Pinchot may have credit for using was just so much lost energy, in the light of past events, which history shows a certain class of stockmen to have been the originators of the leasing policy, but were so bitterly opposed by the smaller stockmen of the country that, in spite of the vigorous efforts on the part of that certain class of organized stockgrowers and the millions of dollars expended by them to have the policy adopted, the measure was defeated at two congresses, and for a while the scheme was thought to have been a dead issue. Mr. Pinchot has the confidence of the people, which fact makes his influence valuable prey for those wide-awake stockmen who had tried various other methods of creating the range leasing policy. The people have not forgotten the fight that was put up by the small stockmen and the settlers against the range leasing measures in 1901 and 1902. However different the proposal promoted by Mr. Pinchot may seem to the people, the principle is the same and will result in the same benefits to the original promoters of the leasing law. However, the only reward the small stockman can hope for in a fight against the range leasing, is to stave off final action till he can get out of the business; it is the only possible means by which the large stockgrowers can hold sway and continue to grow, since the government has become so watchful over its remaining public lands to not allow it to get into the hands of these large companies without a reasonable compensation, and through some channel, under some disguise, a leasing law will eventually be passed and the ranges will be grabbed up by the large growers to the practical exclusion of the rancher who depends upon the outside range for pasture for his little dab of cattle or horses, and the homesteader will find himself shut out with a barbed wire fence.

Klamath county, at least that portion of it in the vicinity of the county seat, is up in arms against a proposition that has come up in legislature to create the county of Deschutes out of northern Klamath and southern Crook counties, with Bend as the county seat. Klamath county people say it would take \$2,500,000 off the assessment roll of their county.
