**SUMMONS**

IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR LAKE COUNTY.

Ruby Harvey and Dick J. Wilcox, as executrix and executor of the last will and testament of William Harvey deceased, and of the estate thereof, Plaintiffs, vs. J. S. Field, Julia Field, Otis Chandler, George E. Chandler, Andrew McCallen, Defendants, and Phillip Lynch, brought in as defendant, by cross-complaint of the defendant Andrew McCallen, Plaintiff.

Suit to foreclose a mortgage.

Summons in cross-suit of the above-named Andrew McCallen.

To J. S. Field and Julia Field, the above named defendants:—

IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON, You and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the cross-complaint of the aforesaid Andrew McCallen filed against you herein, in the above entitled court, and cause on or before the 9th day of May 1907, said date being the last day of the time prescribed in the order of publication of summons made herein, and if you fail so to answer, for want thereof, the said Andrew McCallen will apply to the court for the relief prayed for in his said cross-complaint, which is: That he, the said Andrew McCallen, take a decree against you, the defendants J. S. Field and Julia Field, foreclosing a mortgage on real property, executed by you on Sept. 25, 1901, in favor of M. T. Walters, which said mortgage, together with the promissory note thereby secured, have been assigned and indorsed to said Andrew McCallen by said M. T. Walters, prior to the commencement of the said cross-complaint; to recover the money due and owing on said note and mortgage, namely:—The sum of three hundred thirty two dollars and twenty two cents, with interest thereon from Oct. 7, 1905, at the rate of ten per cent per annum, and fifty dollars attorney's fees and costs of suit; for an order of sale of the lands and premises retained as security in said mortgage and described as follows:—Commencing at the South East corner of Block "O" in the west addition to the Town of Lakeview, Lake County Oregon, according to the plat thereof filed in the office of the County Clerk of the County and State aforesaid, on July the 20, 1878, thence running North one hundred and seventy three feet; thence at right angles running west 140 feet, thence at right angles running north 102 feet, thence at right angles running west 140 feet to the west boundary line of Block "N"; also in said west addition to said Town, thence South along the west boundary lines of said blocks "O" and "N" 275 feet to the south west corner of said block "O", thence east along the south boundary line of said block "O" two hundred and eighty feet to the place of beginning; also the N 1/2 of the South-east quarter, SW 1/4 of NE 1/4 and the SE 1/4 of NW 1/4 of section 14, Tp. 40, S., R. 21 East of Willamette Meridian, in Oregon; also that a certain deed executed by you, the said J. S.
