At first we thought Mr. Leehman was joking, but he said it was a fact; he really had some oranges in bloom. They brought some grape fruit one time, and the children planted some of the seed, and they grew, and by taking good care of the plants, they have bloomed out this year. Grape fruit is a new fruit, which is said to be a cross between an orange and a lemon. The fruit is very large, nearly twice as large as the largest size oranges, and has a flavor similar to that of an orange only sour. Mr. Leehman remarked with all sincerity, that "we will yet have a tropical climate here." Continuing with the statement which all old residents of the valley will concur in, that when he first came here it was nothing to see snow three or four feet deep, and lay on the ground way late in the following summer. Also that it was impossible to raise potatoes there. Now look at the fruit we raise here, and the mild winters we have; scarcely any snow to speak of, and seldom enough to make sleighing for a day. It would be no more surprising to the present residents of this valley to be told that in twenty years from now oranges and lemons would be growing here, than it would have been to the early settlers if they had been told that within twenty years from the time of their coming here apples and peaches would be raised here.
