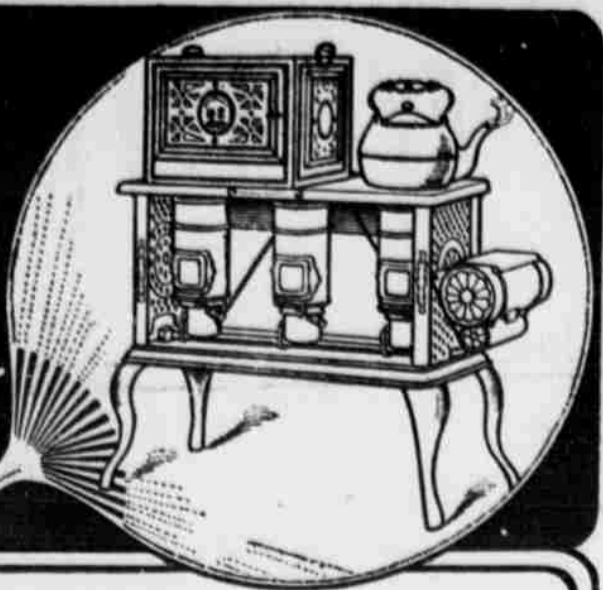

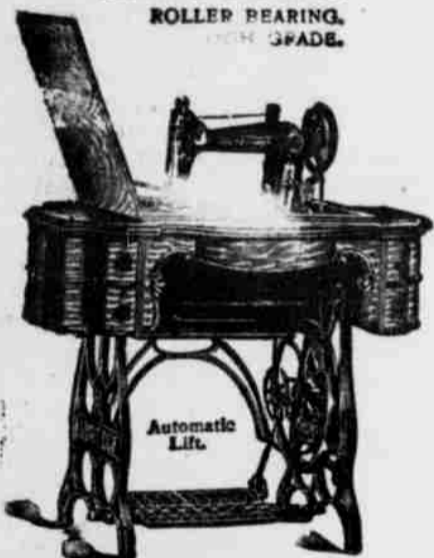

Also that certain deed from the State of Oregon to R. F. McConnaughey, dated August 21, 1891, purporting to convey 1,924.82 acres of land.

Also that certain deed issued by the State of Oregon to R. F. McConnaughey, dated March 23, 1893, purporting to convey 1,558.70 acres of land.

Also that certain deed issued by the State of Oregon to Warner Valley Stock Company on the 23rd day of June, 1899, purporting to convey 5,228.11 acres of land, all of said lands situate in Lake County, Oregon, together with certificates of sale and other papers and deeds relating to said lands mentioned and described in the complaint, be declared unauthorized, illegal, fraudulent and void and decreed to be given up and canceled, and that the rights of the plaintiff and of each of said defendants settling on said lands under United States Land Laws or the laws of the State of Oregon be declared and decreed and that the Warner Valley Stock Company, its officers, agents, and servants be restrained from selling, conveying or encumbering, or from interfering in any manner with the possession of said several tracts or parcels of land, or any of them, pending this suit or until the further order of this court, and that upon the final hearing, such injunction be made perpetual, and praying for costs and disbursements of this suit and such other and further relief as to the court may seem meet and equitable.
