CORN HARVEST. The Binder For Silage Corn--The Shocker on Small Farms.

The corn binder is used to greatest advantage in fields where the corn is check rowed...



INCLINED CORN BINDER. binder over cutting by hand or sled harvester is the amount of work which can be accomplished...

The present form of shocker consists essentially of dividers, a revolving table for assembling the shock and a crane for removing it.

Corn shockers cost about as much as binders and weigh approximately the same. The wear and tear on the shocker is probably not so great as on the binders.

From replies to questions we have a total cost of harvesting corn with a shocker of \$1.00 per acre compared with the cost of \$1.18 per acre for harvesting with a sled harvester...

The manual labor in harvesting corn is the least when using the shocker. The shock made by the corn shocker is not so easily loaded on a wagon as is that made by a corn binder...

The corn binder is well adapted for cutting corn for the silo, as the bundles are bound into convenient size to be loaded on a wagon.

Experiment in Tame Grasses. The great question offers what it believes great improvements on the West European ranges.

The experiments will begin in Wallawa County, in southeastern Oregon, in the Klamath National Forest.

The purpose of these wet meadow experiments is improvement of the summer range. Stock do not winter in the mountains, but are driven gradually higher and higher as the advancing season calls forth the vegetation on which they feed.

Winter is almost sure to catch those who suffered last year for want of coal in a still worse condition.

Dear Sir and Friend: I have taken your paper for nearly two years and it is the best paper in the county. But pardon me for calling your attention to an article in your September 5th number, headed, 'Favors Actual Settler.' You say 'It is to be hoped that he who seeks the land in good faith will win out.'

Now, I claim they all seek the land in good faith, whether he seeks it, timber claim, or homestead claim, or if one man uses all three methods. They are all three of them perfectly honest methods, and legalized by our government, and a man commits no perjury who files on a piece of land as a homestead and later on, in one day, one week, one month or one year, relinquishes it to the government or to an individual and files on it as a timber claim, or the man who relinquishes to files on it as a timber claim, or a homestead, either, or a man may file on a piece of land as a timber claim, and afterwards change his mind and relinquish it and file again on the same land as a homestead; and in my opinion commits no perjury.

Please favor me with an answer, as I would be very much pleased to know whether I am right in my opinions, or whether your statements in your article are right.

One more thing in your article I wish you would explain, that is, you say 'numerous contests are likely to follow.' Now why are they? Please state the reason why.

Now your whole article is framed up in a way to scare or intimidate people who have good intentions in regard to that land, and if you are mistaken, besides answering this letter to me, I hope you will print another article to correct the one I refer to, as the article I refer to is very misleading and somewhat sensational.

The article referred to appears below. The same was published Sept. 5th:

Opening of the Reserve. Hundreds of people are expected here at the opening of the reserve on October 28, when the lands will be open for filing or selection.

There is a possibility, however, that in favoring the homeseeker the department has still left a loophole through which the timber lands may be secured by speculators, in not restricting the homestead applicant to a homestead filing alone, on the same tract of land. In order to profit by the leniency of the ruling, it is true, perjury must be committed, and he who is caught at it must look for punishment. Under the present ruling a person may go upon a tract of land on September 28th and begin settlement. On Oct. 28, he can file a homestead on the ground of prior occupation. After the smoke has settled he may then relinquish his homestead filings and file a timber and stone claim, which does not require residence upon the land for five years to gain title. Numerous contests are likely to follow, and it is to be hoped that he who seeks the land in good faith will win out.

A Damaging Frost. The Klamath Falls Herald credits Lake County with a damaging frost. Also states that it frosted over in Rogue River valley, just on the other side. We have not heard of any damage from frost except in one or two places where the tender garden stuff was nipped in Lake county.

That little spot over in Klamath county that gets chilled at the rapid progress of the two valleys on either side of it, Goose Lake valley and Rogue River valley, had a touch of frost itself. Situated as Klamath claims to be, between two 'undesirable' valleys, it is difficult to understand how that spot could have escaped, provided, however, there had been anything there to freeze.

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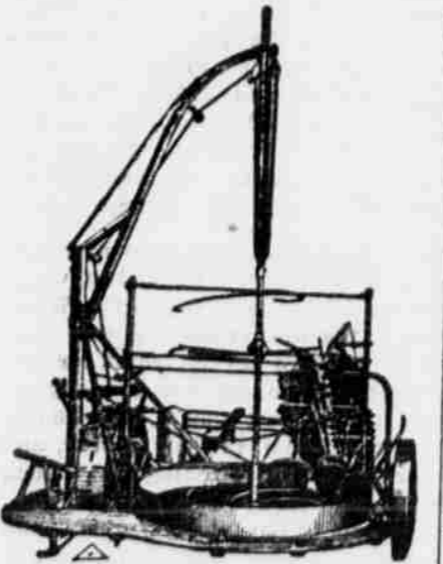
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CORN HARVESTER AND SHOCKER.
