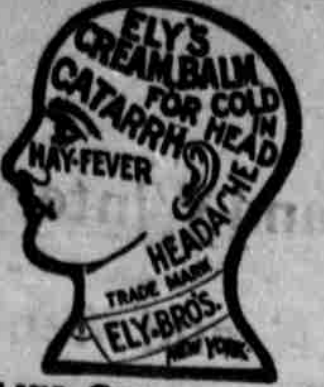


Youth In Its Golden Prime.
