As the term of Senator McLaurin does not expire till 1911 the representative has ample time in which to prepare for the toga.  
The prospective senator, however, is well equipped to take the job at a moment's notice, having spent fourteen years in the lower house. Four years ago he was chosen floor leader of the minority and will doubtless retain that leadership in the Sixtieth congress.
