
The Defects of the Antitrust Law.



HE Sherman antitrust law makes criminal all agreements in restraint of trade, whether they are IN-HERENT Y criminal or not. It makes in these general terms some ling criminal without further definition. Now, this is THE DAY OF THE TRADE AGREEMENT in the United States.

We have autional, vity, see and di trict agreements in restraint of trade, and they are ments in the purpose always of extorting an unreasonab wice I would not for a moment defend an agreement in restr. an of trade which had for its purpose the extorting from the public of a unreasonable price. It should be under the ban of the law. But the trouble with the Sherman antitrust law is that it makes EQUALLY CRIMINAL an agreement in restraint of trade which is inherently innecent.

An agreement in traint of trade not to sell below cost IS NOT OF NECESSITY DISADVANTAGE AND INJURY to a community, for certainly we have heard a great deal recently about great institutions up | reeling for a period of time in certain locallties, selling below cost for the purpose of crushing out competition in order that they may later exercise a monopoly and raise the price. A great many of these agreements in restraint of trade are for the purpose of existence, not of extortion, of letting a reasonable amount of sompetition exist.

THE SHERMAN ANTITRUST LAW ACTUALLY PUTS A PREMIUM UPON A CONSOLIDATION AND CONCENTRATION UP TO A CER-TAIN POINT, FOR PROVIDED ALL COMPETITION IS NOT DE-STROYED IT ENCOURAGES THE CONSOLIDATION OF COMPETING CORPORATIONS UP TO A CERTAIN POINT, BECAUSE THEY CAN DO LEGALLY THEN AS A CORPORATION WHAT WOULD BE IL-LEGAL AND CRIMINAL IF DONE AS SEPARATE CORPORATIONS UNDER A TRADE AGREEMENT. THE VERY EFFECT OF THAT LAW HAS BEEN TO ENCOURAGE THE MORE RAPID CRUSHING OUT OF COMPETITION IN THIS COUNTRY.

If REAL PROGRESS is to be made toward the solution of the vexed industrial problems which confront the nation, this law should be amended so as to clearly define what shall constitute illegality in trade agreements.

Jail Cure For Trust Offenders, Not Fines.

HAVE NOTICED A GOOD MANY COMPLAINTS THAT CRIMI-NAL PROSECUTIONS AGAINST TRUST MAGNATES AND SEN-TENCES OF IMPRISONMENT FOR THEM HAVE BEEN VERY INFREQUENT AND, IN FACT, FOR PRACTICAL PURPOSES Blank must have been heavily in-UNKNOWN. IT IS PERFECTLY TRUE THAT, IN MY OPINION AT LEAST, A BETTER MORAL EFFECT WOULD BE PRODUCED BY SENDING A FEW PROMINENT MEN TO JAIL THAN BY A GREAT DEAL OF LITIGATION, HOWEVER SUCCESSFUL, AGAINST THE CORPORATIONS THEY CONTROLLED.

But it must be remembered that it is only SUCCESSFUL prosecutions which would have a good effect. Some time since two corporations and their respective presidents were indicted jointly for violation of the criminal provisions of the antitrust law. If the corporations were guilty of such, it would be hard for the lay mind at least to understand how their presidents could be innocent. Nevertheless THE JURY CONVICTED THE CORPORATIONS AND AC-QUITTED THE PRESIDENTS.

It is the avowed purpose of the department of justice to prosecute criminally any one who is really responsible for violations of the antitrust law wherever it can do so with any REASONABLE probability of success. It does not care to prosecute mere underlings who are known to every one to have acted under the direct authority of their superiors.

WE ARE NOW FACING THE BIG QUESTION OF BRINGING BIG CORPORATIONS TO TIME. WHAT DOES A FINE AMOUNT TO? DO YOU THINK IT MEANS THAT THE CORPORATIONS WILL STOP ITS WRONGDOING? WHO PAYS THE FINE FOR LAWBREAKING BUT YOU AND IT THE ONE THING TO DO IS TO PUT THE GUILTY OFFICERS IN JAIL. THAT MIGHT PERHAPS INDUCE THEM TO HAVE SOME REGARD FOR THE LAW AND ORDER.
