There is said to be little hope for action on the recommendations of Postmaster-General Meyer for a parcels post law and postal savings bank at this session of congress. Speaker Cannon has been showered with protests from the merchants of small towns to prevent such a law as the parcels post law to be seriously considered.

Governor Chamberlain has announced that after the 14th, the holiday period will come to a close, unless something unforeseen comes to pass. The special session of the legislature is still being discussed.

Mrs. Anna M. Bradley, was acquitted of the murder of former U. S. Senator Arthur M. Brown, of Utah. The case was a sensational one throughout and uncovered crime and immorality shocking in the extreme.

Tirey L. Ford, who has been on trial in San Francisco on a charge of bribery connected with the trolley line franchise, was acquitted on the 3d, after five hours' deliberation by the jury.

The Oregonian has declared its independence of the Republican party. The unfaithfulness of Republicans over the state is given as a reason for so doing.

The President's message to the 60th Congress was read on the 3d and two hours was consumed in the reading, which contained 30,000 words.

The U. S. Congress convened last Tuesday.
