Hawley Making Good

That Congressman W. C. Hawley is the sort of man Oregon needs in congress is evidenced by the following from a Washington correspondent to the Oregonian:

"Representative Hawley, of Oregon, is 'making good.' He has shown during his brief career in Congress that he is made of the right kind of stuff. If the people of his district have the good sense to return him term after term, they will find at the end of a few years that they have one of the strongest Representatives from the entire West.

Though untrained in a legislative career, Mr. Hawley is rapidly learning the ropes in Washington, and is laying a sound foundation for a successful congressional career. He did not come to Washington with a reputation he was not known as a humorist; he was not heralded as a 'boy orator' or 'boy wonder'; he was not advertised as a freak of any sort. He was just a plain new congressman, to be judged by his actual worth. He made no pretenses; he claimed no honor."

Mr. Hawley regrets very much that he has been called away to Oregon to register, but owing to an oversight in the primary law, he must do so in order to be a candidate for re-election. Mr. Hawley has not missed a day in congress, always on hand, no matter how dry and uninteresting the session of that body. This is the course all great men have pursued in congress. By so doing they are able to seize any opportunity that might arise at an unexpected time and enable them to secure favorable action on local legislation. Mr. Hawley is the making of one of the greatest congressmen the West has ever had.

Fulton Will Answer Heney

When Senator Fulton received the full text of F. J. Heney's charges he at once decided to come to Oregon and meet Mr. Heney and refute all his accusations. But Mr. Heney made arrangements to go to San Francisco as soon as he had finished the Hall case and could not meet the Senator. A few days later, however, he gave out the following to the Oregonian's Washington correspondent:

"In announcing my intention of returning to Oregon, I have received a great number of telegrams from business men, urging me to continue at my post of duty, and I have concluded for the present to remain here. My own judgment and inclination were to go to Oregon and make a speech, and perhaps several, in answer to Mr. Heney's attack, but I am assured by so many citizens of Oregon that my duty is to remain here at work that I concluded to be guided by their judgment. I shall as soon as I can get some necessary data prepared and forward in the press of Oregon a written statement relating the charges, and later, before the primary election, will probably arrange to spend some days in and deliver some speeches in Oregon."
