A State Senator

Harry L. Holgate, of Klamath county, was in Corvallis last week on a visit to his father, Judge Holgate, who is recovering from a severe illness.

The Oregonian of recent date notes that Mr. Holgate will be a candidate for the republican senatorial nomination to represent the district consisting of Crook, Klamath and Lake counties. The item occasions much interest here for Harry was born and reared in Corvallis and is a graduate of Oregon Agricultural college. He served in the Philippine Islands as a soldier in the 24 Oregon volunteer regiment, and at the time of his enlistment was a resident of Corvallis. He is a member of the Oregon bar and for four years was attorney for the United States reclamation service in which position he was highly successful and in the Washington office was known as the "diplomat of the service." For several years he has been resident of Klamath county and is now managing a bank at Bonanza. He takes great interest in the agricultural development of that part of Oregon and besides "actually farming" a farm, he is connected with a successful creamery, two farmer telephone line companies and other like enterprises.

The people of that senatorial district are to be congratulated on their opportunity for sending to the upper house of the legislature a dependable and capable legislator. Several bills of which Mr. Holgate was the author are now laws in this state and California. He has a wide acquaintance among the public men of Oregon and will have marked influence in the state senate. The three counties make up a great empire themselves, but one largely undeveloped, and they need the public service of their best citizens.—Benton County Republican.
