The Fallacy of It.

The Silver Lake Oregonian came out last week in flashy colors, making the subject of county seat removal the occasion.

The methods pursued by that paper will undoubtedly prove fatal to the movement, if it stood a chance otherwise. Its methods are misleading, its statements untrue, and its purpose selfish. It is true, Paisley, or a majority of the people of that town, would be glad to have the county seat moved to that place, providing the cost to them would not be too great, and providing the money they have already provided by taxation could be converted from Lakeview to that town for the construction of a court house. A number of Silver Lakers have joined in with Paisley to assist in the movement, probably with the belief erroneously advocated by the Silver Lake Oregonian that the money that has been set aside for the building of a court house in Lakeview would be transferred to Paisley, should the movement carry. No the impression that that paper has, either fully or ignorantly, given out is misleading, as Lakeview is the county seat of Lake County, the material for the new building has been bought and paid for and is on the ground, and the contracts for its construction have been let, and assessments levied and the money will be collected for the construction, and the building will be nearly completed before it is possible to change the county seat. The old court house has been sold, and arrangements made for its immediate removal, so that the work of constructing the new building can be commenced at once. There is no law in the United States that can prevent the contractors from carrying out their contracts and collecting for their work. The people of Lake County have paid for the new court house to be built in Lakeview, and we assert with every assurance of being right, that there is not an unbiased and unselfish taxpayer in the county who will wish to build another court house in this county at the present time, simply to satisfy a trifling spite of a few whose interests might be enhanced by removal of the county seat to another place in the county, unless they favor a division of the county. The Oregonian states what is not true, when it says that Lakeview could not get a signer to a remonstrance against the movement in Warner. Its purpose is selfish, for the reason that, as The Examiner said a few weeks ago, that that paper was down and out at Silver Lake and must seek new fields, and is pulling its last string. Mr. Lester, publisher of that paper, has been driven out of Silver Lake with his suds, and must seek a new field, and where he is, his paper must be also. If we hear a right, his life will be short in Paisley, as it is stated that that town will go dry at the June election. He is simply pleading to the people of Lake County to aid him in re-establishing himself and his paper, and providing a paying field for him. A very prominent citizen of Paisley stated a few days ago in the presence of a large crowd that he was not guilty of subscribing for that paper or of ever having read it. There are none so enthusiastic in the movement as that paper, and its purpose is purely selfish. Personal gain is its sole purpose. There will be many who will be disgusted with the misleading statements and underhand methods pursued by such an unpopular paper as the Silver Lake Oregonian. Lake County is very large, and at some time will be made into two counties. This will be done as soon as the northern part of the county feels like it would like division, and will not be opposed by the south end of the county, so far as we can learn. The south end does not desire to stand in the way of the progress of the north end of the county nor to retard its development in the least. In fact, the south end will favor such a move at the next legislative session, should the north end so desire. But when the attempt is made to remove the county seat from Lakeview, a strong fight will be put up, and one that will win out, too. There are people in Silver Lake, and we venture to say in Paisley also, who will not favor the removal of the county seat, for the reason given above; that this county has no use for two court houses.
