All Things Equal

A North end paper States that a County Seat should be at "the geographical center of the County, all other things being equal." We are perfectly willing this shall be the rule of determining whether the County Seat of Lake County shall be removed to Paisley, or remain in Lakeview. The other things which should be equal are the nearness of the place to the bulk of the population, its accessibility, and the preparedness of the town to accommodate the people in every line of business.

Lakeview is nearer to three fourths of the population than is Paisley. It is of more easy access to all these people than Paisley is. Lakeview is well provided with Banks and Paisley has none. Paisley is deficient in hotel and stable accommodations, has no Saddler, Furniture store, no Hardware and general farm implement store, no newspaper, no water works, and no system of lighting the town, while Lakeview is well up in all these respects, and is not in any respect as a town, inferior to Paisley. The geographical center of Lake County is not in any feature, equally eligible as a County Seat as Lakeview. Lakeview wins by every test.

Store the Water

Water that should be stored away for furnishing power to run the flour mill to be built in Lakeview and for irrigating the large tract of land south and west of Lakeview, is running to waste now through Deadman canyon. Nature has provided an abundance of water, both for power and irrigation purposes, and until the people wake up to their duty in making use of the bountiful resources supplied by kind Nature, they will not fully realize the true greatness of the opportunities lying open at our door. Why complain of a lack of water for power and irrigation purposes, when such a large stream of water is running to waste to the Lake through Deadman canyon, right through our city? Nature has also provided a magnificent reservoir site high up the canyon, and causes an ample sufficiency of water to keep it full. But Nature does not, and never will put in dams to hold the water and lay pipes for its conveyance to power plants at the mouth of the canyon. Nature has provided men with brains to do this part of the work. In fact everything has been provided, without cost, except the energy to make the connections; Where is that?

In Lake County South of Paisley there are four times the people that reside in the county North of Paisley. The convenience of this excess of population, though many of them be women who cannot vote, should be considered by every unselfish voter, and will be. Women are citizens, and have rights and duties as citizens. The generous voter will remember this.
