### The County Seat Question

More than a year passed after the Lake County Court decided to build a new Court House at Lakeview, and two levies of taxes had been made to pay for it, the material bought and paid for, and contracts were let for the work, before the agitators of the North end announced their determination to remove the County Seat. No people ever acted more disingenuous than these leading agitators have, and we know there are numbers of fair minded men in the North who would not have waited so long in announcing their intention to try to move the County Seat to Paisley, and who don't approve of the action of those who are leading the movement at this time.

The conditions will compel the organization of a new county, composed of the Northern precincts of Lake and contiguous territory of adjoining counties.

The vast amount of rich arable lands in that region, formerly supposed to be unproductive, arid desert, have been found to grow good crops, and the great influx of new settlers in the two years last past clearly point to a new county and, should the people of Southern Lake array themselves against it with all their power they could not prevent it. Part of this land being in Crook, Harney and Klamath Counties, many of the new homes would be one hundred or more miles from their county seat, while some of those in Lake, even with the County seat at Paisley, would yet be seventy five miles away. It would be folly to think of preventing a new County when they have gained the required population, and that day is near at hand, if the Silver Lake papers are not mislead, as to the rapidity of the settlement of these lands.

### What They Can Have

Lakeview the permanent County Seat of Lake, and a new County North of Lake, is a fair and rational adjustment of the rights of all concerned, and this the North end can have whenever they are ready.

To this manner of adjustment, the South end is committed, and we hereby notify the agitators of the North, who are clamoring for removal of the County Seat, that NO OTHER SETTLEMENT WILL BE MADE. NO OTHER IS POSSIBLE.

We have been handed a voluminous set of resolutions passed by the people of Silver Lake concerning the discovery of the body of Julius Wallende, who disappeared from that place last Fall, but owing to the lack of space we have been unable to publish the same in this issue.

Judge Thos. G. Hailey, who was appointed by Chamberlain as state supreme judge to fill a vacancy created by the appointment of Judge Wolverton to the Federal judgeship, died in Portland Sunday, March 15th, from the effects of a surgical operation. Judge Hailey was one of the most prominent Democratic statesmen in Oregon. He was born in Oregon in 1865.

A. E. Pearson, of Alturas, special promotion agent for the Modoc County Development company, was in Lakeview last week gathering information for a large circular this promotion company is getting out for that county. They have received \$500 from the county, and will issue ten thousand pamphlets, illustrated, and 100 pages of descriptive matter.

M. R. Biggs of Prineville, who was caught in the land fraud net and convicted in 1905 and sentenced to 10 months in the county jail of Multnomah county and to pay a \$500 fine, was released on the 19th, having served his time out and paid the fine.

W. C. Bristol has stepped down from the office of U. S. District Attorney for Oregon, and handed over the keys to John McCourt, who was recently appointed.
