"Go ahead, my boy, and I will see you through," said Daly.

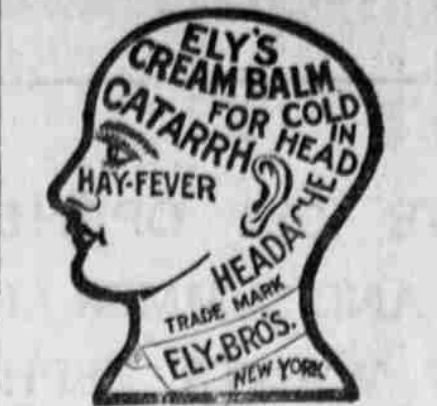
The boy is twenty years old and hopes to enter a seminary soon to begin his ecclesiastical studies.
