From Mrs. Duniway

To the Editor:

Your courtesy in sending to me, as
President of the Oregon State Equal
Suffrage Association, a marked copy
of your newspaper of April 23d con-
taining a long and carefully studied
editorial under the caption "Suffrage
Not a Right," leads me to hope you
will not refuse to publish this re-
joinder:

I am glad, for your sake, that you
and all law-abiding sons of Oregon's
faithful pioneer mothers are not ra-
ted in law, as women are, with
"idiots" insane persons and crimin-
als; glad you are not taxed without
representation and governed without
consent, as women are; glad, if you
are married, that you are not a ser-
vant without wages; glad, if you are
a bachelor, that you are not condemn-
ed, as are the bachelor women of Ore-
gon, to endure the penalties of dis-
franchisement, such as are now borne
for instance by the women stenog-
raphers of Portland, who are this
week to be thrown out of the employ-
ment upon which they depend for
bread to make room in the offices of
the great corporations in their various
precincts for men who have votes.

While I am glad, for the sake of the
sons of women, that your right to
vote is not trembling in the balance,
before the coming June election, in
the interest of an aristocracy of wo-
men, I do rejoice to see one splendid
paragraph in your editorial which
upsets all the rest, being quite as ap-
plicable to women as to men. You
say, (and I copy the paragraph be-
cause I am saving the article for the
maker of one Historical Scrapbook
and don't want to cut and paste it)
that "There are mutual rights which
belong to all alike, which are life, li-
berty, the enjoyment of the fruit of
one's own labor and the pursuit of
happiness without interference with
the rights of others." You draw a dis-
tinction between rights and privileges
which would, if applicable alike to all
the people, instead of an aristocracy
of sex, cover the entire ground.

You say "every citizen has a right
to a trial by a jury of his peers." Then
why deny that right to one half
of the citizens? If women are not
people why hold them amenable to
laws? If they are people why deny to
them the equal protection of the laws?
And, if they are not people, what are
they? Women deplore, as you do,
the fact that men have been generous
(instead of just) to women in making

laws which often bear unequally upon
men. Is this right? How would you
like for women to make all the laws
that govern both halves of the people?
And, if women, in so doing, should
sometimes overdo themselves in gen-
erosity when you demanded justice
would you be satisfied with the re-
sult?

I shall not weary you by dissecting
your many rapunzel's sermim. But
I must call your attention to the one-
sided views you entertain as to the
marriage relation. The husband and
wife are one in all true marriages, and
that one is both of them. They con-
stitute a united head. Between them
there can be no altercation as to either
rights or privileges. They are a
mutual law unto one another. But
the state in obliging a husband (if re-
creant to his vows or duties) to as-
sume his duty, has made, in every re-
creant case on record, a lamentable
faulpre. Witness every man who whips
his wife, every man whose wife sup-
ports him and every man who deserts
his family, all of whom are anti suf-
fragist of a most virulent type, against
whose bludgeon (the ballot) 40,000 law
abiding women are quietly organized
for the impending battle of ballots,
their only emblem in this unequal
contest being a flag of truce, under
which they are mutely appealing to
all honorable men for the free and
equal protection of the laws under a
Republican form of government, of
every natural right for themselves for
which men have found the ballot their
only safeguard, and of which, as the
late Senator Dolph said, in a speech
before the United States Senator in
1884, "No reasons can be given for
man suffrage that cannot be urged
with equal force in favor of woman
suffrage".

Of course you will have printed, be-
fore this reaches you all the capital
you can make out of the fact that
one Mrs. Wilber, state of Massachu-
setts, a childless woman who calls her-
self the "Association Opposed," etc.
etc., who succeeded (after raking the
state over for followers) in venturing
to use as her catspaws the names of
19 women besides her own in a re-
monstrance against the Equal Natural
Rights of the people, which as you say,
"belong to all alike," for which 40,000
of us are asking your votes. We are
relying upon a majority of the voters
of Lake County to prove to Mrs. Wil-
ber, by their votes in favor of our
amendment that they are not afraid
to trust their mothers, wives, sisters,
daughters and sweethearts with the
full and free possession of every nat-
ural right, even including Mrs. Wil-
ber's preference for the undisturbed
pursuit of her varied pastimes, bridge
whist, pink teas and ping-pong.

The men of Oregon—God bless
them—are managing our present suf-
frage campaign. Women are not
beating tambourines nor tooting
horns. Men have financed, circulated,
signed and certified our initiative pe-
titions; and we believe they will heed
the prayer of the 40,000 women of
Oregon who are expectantly awaiting
their enfranchisement through the
votes of men at the coming State elec-
tion. "Behold we stand at the door
and knock".
