Depth of a Foster-Mother's Love

One of the recent letters received by the editor of the Child-Rescue Campaign of The Delinquent makes us feel that, after all, we know very little. It is a natural assumption that an adopted child cannot take the place of a natural one, but the writer of this letter declares from her personal experience that her adopted children are as dear as her own.

"The Delinquent"
"Dear Sir—"

"I am reading with much interest your campaign for the child. I want to protest against a clause in the article 'Doesn't anybody want a little boy?' He wouldn't be THE little boy and mother couldn't love him in just the same way.

"I know that to be false. I took two little boys when they were babies, and I have three children of my own. One of the little boys died at the age of three, and my loss was as great as when I lost one of my own. The other one is now seven years old and the hardest child to manage I ever tried to manage.

"Still he is as dear to every member of the household as any other. We are working people, and I—the mother have to be away from home all day, and the child's care falls on my father—seventy-five years old and a daughter sixteen; think we are competent to say one can love a child not only of a different blood but a different race and a different faith—at least the parents wear a different faith; the child was taken when four months old.

"So PLEASE tell people they will love them just as dearly and perhaps be more proud of them than they are of their own.

Restoration to Entry of Lands in National Forests

Notice is hereby given that the lands described below, embracing 440 acres, within the Fremont National Forest Oregon, will be subject to settlement and entry under the provisions of the homestead laws of the United States and the act of June 11, 1906 (34 Stat., 233), at the United States land office at Lakeview, Oregon, on July 28, 1908. Any settler who was actually and in good faith claiming any of said land for agricultural purposes prior to January 1, 1906, and has not abandoned same, has a preference right to make a homestead entry for the lands actually occupied. Said lands were listed upon the applications of the persons mentioned below, who have a preference right subject to the prior right of any such settler, provided such settler or applicant is qualified to make homestead entry and the preference right is exercised prior to July 28, 1908, on which date the lands will be subject to settlement and entry by any qualified person. The lands are as follows:

The E half of NW quarter, the NE quarter of SW quarter, Sec. 1, T. 33, S. R. 16 E., W. Mer., listed upon application of G. A. Frederick, Summer Lake, Oregon. The S half of SE quarter, the NW quarter of SE quarter, the NE qr. of SW quarter, Sec. 25, T. 27 S., R. 13 E., application of John J. Lundquist, Silver Lake, Oregon. The SW quarter of SE quarter, Sec. 15, the NW quarter of NE quarter, the N half of NW quarter, Sec. 22, T. 27 S., R. 13 E., application of A. H. Lundquist, Silver Lake, Oregon. Fred Dennett, Commissioner of the General Land Office. Approved May 13, 1908. Frank Pierce, First Assistant Secretary of the Interior. Lists 1120, 1501 and 1540. 23-4
