The above is from the Oregonian of the 4th, and the editor declares it to be a fact, from 'inside knowledge', gained before the election. Thus we have the anomalous situation of a republican legislature, of a strongly republican state, pledged to elect a most partisan democrat to the United States Senate by the deliberate purpose and act of republican voters, not for the purpose of electing the democrat, but, to compel the legislature to commit at least, moral perjury, by electing a man not of the choice of the voters of either party.

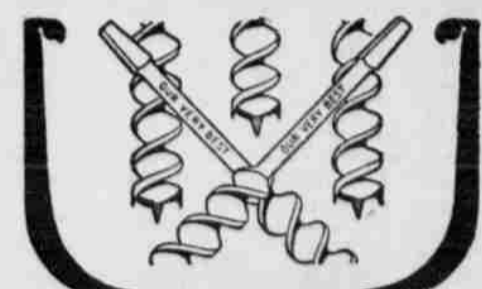
