GRIST OF NEWS FROM HOAG MINES

C. E. McCrory, the energetic mining man of New Pine Creek, who is heavily interested in the Hoag Mining District in the range above that town, wires us the following news of that camp today.

The Modoc Development company has taken control of the Josephine mine, under a bond and lease, and has started a force of men at work developing the property. Supplies to last several months have been brought to the mine from Likely. Work will be prosecuted in a vigorous manner. Some very rich visible gold specimens have been taken from this property. In fact it is the same vein as that of the Fern mine, and we would not be at all surprised if the result of this work shows something very satisfactory.

The gold brick on exhibition at the First National Bank Lakeview was produced from seven and a half tons of rock from the Scheur & Bassler lease on the Sunshine property. The brick was from the free gold caught on the pates. The tailings, after having roasted and cyanided should yield quite as much more gold.

The wagon road, now under construction, is complete beyond Rock Lake, and will be finished to the summit by the middle of October.
