RESULT OF BOOSTING

One of the things very noticeable in Oregon to a new comer, especially in the newspapers, is the freedom from jealousy of one locality over another. There is no ridiculing the pretensions of one locality by another.

No disparagement of one part of the state by the others. There seems to be a spontaneity in this regard. If a stroke of good fortune comes to some particular locality, the entire press of the state rings with exultation.

It has set people to thinking of the state, its productions, its opportunities for a home and business. There is a clamor for more and more information, and the flood of newspapers, and other printed and illustrated information, going out to the world from Oregon is rolling a tide of migration to the state that is overwhelming in its magnitude.

And in this particular Lakeview is no exception. Strangers are coming every day and the problem of how to house them is becoming a serious one and especially so, when we know of the systematic and widespread advertising that is now being done toward encouraging people to locate here by the Oregon Valley Land Company.

There is plenty of money here, and any one who will supply this need will secure a good return on the investment. Evidence is had of this in the avidity with which each new domicile as soon as finished is snapped up by some new arrival.

In a recent letter the President gives the following reasons for desiring to see Taft succeed him in office: "For the last ten years, while I have been governor of New York and President, I have been thrown into closest intimacy with him and in every essential point stood in hearty agreement, shoulder to shoulder. We have the same views as to what is demanded by the national interest and honor, both within our borders and as regards the relations of this nation with other nations."

There is no fight for decency and fair dealing which I have waged in which I have not had his heartiest and most effective sympathy and support, and the policies for which I stand are his policies as much as mine."

Under the election laws of Oregon, registration of voters reopens today and continues until October 29th.

Voters who have already registered this year are not required to register again for the presidential election. Those who have not registered since the first of January, however, must register if they wish to cast a ballot in November. Voters

who have moved into different precincts than those in which they are registered, will be given the opportunity to record the change so that they may vote at the polling place of the precinct in which they now live.

Six months residence in the state is necessary in order to register though there is no requirement as to residence in the precinct for the registration that begins this week. Foreigners who have been admitted to citizenship, and those who have made declaration of intention one year or more may register and vote at the presidential election.

An official statement issued at the Navy department shows that naval vessels now under construction number 20. Of these, four are battle ships, five torpedo boat destroyers, seven submarine boat destroyers, two colliers and two tug boats. With the exception of the colliers and the tug-boats, all the work is being done in private shipyards. These figures soon will be increased by the addition of the battleships Florida and three colliers, 10 torpedo boat destroyers and submarines.

Gov. Hughes was renominated on the first ballot Tuesday in the New York Republican State convention. He received 87 votes out of 1100 in the convention. He will be reelected, of course, and will be in direct line for the presidency later on. The politicians did not want him any more than they wanted Roosevelt. But the people wanted him as they did Roosevelt, and that settled it in spite of all opposition. Mr. Taft well says: "The people do rule."

Cholera is raging in St. Petersburg. Hundreds of cases reported daily. Manila is troubled also with cholera, and the health authorities are making desperate efforts to stamp it out. The U. S. authorities in Washington are taking necessary steps to prevent its incursion into this country.
