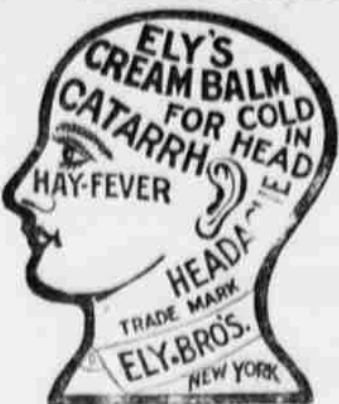

Charming Designs in Cotton Materials. The Coat Shirt Waist.

Among the cotton weaves in border effects and in plain stripes of different widths one can find all kinds of pretty materials for the shirt waist dress, the wrapper, dressing sack or kimono. These materials, considering they are cotton, are by no means cheap, because the border effect places them among the novelty fabrics.

The coat shirt waist is the very newest thing. As its name suggests, it has the appearance of a coat worn over a vest or shirt front. To produce this effect a double breasted vest with a shawl collar is attached to a stiff chemise. This design occurs in white butcher's linen, and the cuffs to the bishop sleeves are often of a contrasting shade of linen, which is also used in facing the shawl collar. White linen gowns showing a touch

of color are smarter this year than all white. Handsome white linen gowns are made up with considerable color in hems, collars, cuffs, belts, etc.—Often these so called hems will be a foot in depth.
