THE LIMEKILN CLUB.

President Gardner Sets out to Purify Its Faults.

MEMBERS SHIVER IN SHOES.

Scores of Them Try to Turn Pale When the Good Brother Entered the Hall With His Jaws "Set"—That Chest of Gold.

A hint had gone out that the president of the Limekiln club meant to take drastic action at the regular Saturday night meeting, and as the members gathered they began to shiver in their shoes. "We hear about dis and dat great financier. How many of 'em have made deir money straight and square, widout robbin' de people?

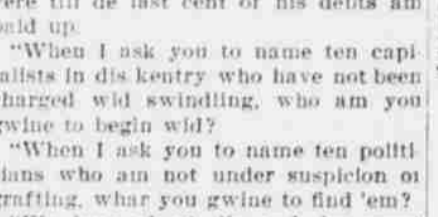
"How many palaces have been erected from de well swindles?
