Some Winter Weather

There was some weather Saturday. The snow fall in the mountains had been heavy. Six feet was reported on Camas Prairie, the mountain summit between here and the Warner valley. The stages on either side were held up, and travelers who attempted to go over the range to Plush were compelled to turn back. The same conditions existed on the pass between here and Paisley.

On Saturday forenoon big flocks of wild geese were seen burrying to the south, an indication of something doing in the cold line, and sure enough the mercury got on a toboggan, and shot down to one degree above zero, but it got warmer and thawed some Sunday. That night it slipped another cog and went bump into 7 below. Then Monday it reached the thawing point again, but slipped back to 4 below during the night; warmed up again Tuesday.

On Wednesday morning there was about 8 inches of moist snow on the ground, and it was still snowing hard as we went to press. The mercury stood at 23 above zero.

This snow fall with what came before means good feed, big crops, and prosperity acres, this year for all of Lake county.

The above reminds us that it is said that the Japanese never discuss the weather. They take the weather, good or bad, as a matter of course, and the children are taught in infancy not to discuss what the weather may be tomorrow, or any time. It is said

by the Japanese that the weather is something that cannot be helped. With Americans, however, the weather is a fruitful source of conversation, and inasmuch as intending settlers here like to read weather reports, we gratify them by giving the daily report from the weather station of the U. S. Government established in Lakeview.

While it has been storming here, and was somewhat cold as above indicated, yet it is no comparison to what people elsewhere, including the Willamette and Columbia valleys, have had to endure. And in the Warner and Summer Lake valleys in Lake county it was still less disagreeable than it was in Lakeview.

Lakeview has been in the throes of considerable alarm and excitement the past week because of the possibility of diphtheria having gained a foothold in town. In view of the situation the authorities, as a precautionary measure, closed the schools Wednesday morning, and also closed the theatre, rink and churches. Two deaths of children from croup was the occasion of the alarm. No new cases having developed, the schools will open next Monday as usual, and the theatre and rink and churches also will be allowed to open their doors.

Lake county has seven male and two female patients in the insane asylum at Salem.
