In the matter of the establishment of a Road District to be known as Road District No. 12 of Lake County Oregon.

Now at this time this cause coming on for hearing upon the petition of W. Long, et al, for the establishment of a new road district in Lake County, Oregon, and it appearing to the court after due consideration that the petition is meritorious, and that there is no remonstrance or objection to granting the prayer of said petitioners, and that the said road district is necessary to the welfare and convenience of said petitioners: It is considered, ordered and adjudged, that a new road district be and the same is hereby established; that the said road district shall be known as Road District No. 12 of the said County of Lake and state of Oregon, and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Lake county, Oregon; thence west along the north boundary of said county to a point where the said boundary line intersects the Range line between Ranges 15 and 16 East; thence south to the Southwest Corner of Township 28 South Range 16 East of the Willamette Meridian, thence east to the east boundary line of said county, thence north along the east boundary line of said county to the place of beginning; that the said Road District No. 12, be for all purposes whatsoever a distinct and separate road district and that the boundaries of all other road districts which are affected by the establishment of the said Road District No. 12 of Lake county, Oregon, be and the same are hereby changed to conform to the boundaries of said road district.
