SALE OF MINE IN HOAG DISTRICT

Wm. Shavers and others have purchased from J. Tod Bonner the south 300 acres of school section 36, situated on top of Mt. Hoag, in the Hoag Mining District. Already there have been two or more very promising leads uncovered on this ground, which will be under vigorous development this coming season.

The Consolidated Co., will erect a mill at the Mt. View mine, situated at the head waters of the south fork of Pine Creek, as quickly as the elements will permit of transporting the machinery to the mountain. We hope to see this mill in operation by July 15th.

The further development of the Hoag District is now a question of milling facilities, as there are four, perhaps five, properties on the mountain that will pay for their own development and in addition thereto, pay a dividend each and every month, once there are milling facilities to crush and save the values of these ores. The snow on the mountain is settling very rapidly and it is only a matter of a very few days until one can travel any where on the crust without the use of snow-shoes. McCLEARY.
