In addition to risking the loss of their orchards, fruit men who neglect to improve the present good weather by the generous use of sprayers will invite lower prices for their inferior fruit.

The orchardists of Lake county better get busy before Inspector Smith "gets busy," in the manner that the Salem inspector has done by cutting down bad trees.

Elder S. B. Chastain left this earthly pilgrimage and went home March 27th 1909.

After an illness of some weeks from typhoid fever, cancer of the stomach developed, from which he suffered intensely for two weeks before death relieved him. An unwavering faith in God and the perfect righteousness of Christ comforted him during his last hours.

Said he, "I want to go and join the company of the blood washed saints of God."

Bro. Chastain was born in Touris County, Georgia, near the town of Hiwassee, in June 2, 1842. Served through the Civil war in Confederate Army, was converted in fall of '64 attended Ft. Hearbes Academy N. C. and was ordained to the full work of the Baptist ministry in 1870.

Married Eliza Wiggins in 1868, who died July 23, 1894. He held his first pastorate at Hardecrabble, Colorado in 1871, and from there served churches in Washington, Josephine and Jackson Counties, Oregon, and thence to Lakeview and Northern California.

Was married to Elizabeth Mason, of Goose Lake Valley, June 2, 1897, who survives him.

Has one child living, Mrs. J. A. Gotcher, with whom his widow resides until such time as she can return to her folks in Surprise Valley.

Many friends followed the earthly portion of Bro. Chastain to its last resting place, beside his first wife, in the cemetery near Williams, Josephine Co, Oregon.

A few years ago \$10,000 were invested in durum wheat which was sowed in a country where one steer required 20 acres for his support. Five years later 3,000,000 acres of this land was sown to durum wheat and produced over 5,000,000 bushels.
