### COUNTY ORCHARDS MUST BE SPRAYED

All farmers or fruit growers in Lake county are hereby notified that under the state law it is imperative that all fruit trees should be sprayed.

For that reason fruit growers must obtain proper appliances in order that such work can be done during the period previous to budding in the spring. It is known that two dangerous fungus growths already have found lodgement in the county. Spraying will destroy all insects and fungus growth.
