

# KILLING OFF A LOT OF COYO

Pendleton Sast Oregonian 12: There are nearly 100 less coyotes to deal with in the vicinity of one sheep range in the Lakeview country, as a result of the extermination campaign inaugurated by the sheepmen last January. There are also that many less for the state to pay bounty on as they were killed during the winter. The above is in accordance with a

report received yesterday by Dan P. Smythe, secretary of the state wool-growers' association from Dan Chand-er of Laseview. Mr. Chandler was one of the enthusiastic supporters of the plan for wholesale poisoning and reports that he found 200 coyotes killed by paison on his range and that there were undoubtedly many

killed which were not found.
Figuring that balf of these were females and that each of these would have whelped at least six pups on the average, an estimate of 800 destoyed is very conservative. It is probable that the number actually destroyed by this one man was more than a thousand.

The work of exterminiating the coyotes is nox on in earnest in this section of the state. Sheepmen have arranged to board free of charge, at least one hunter in every familing camp, and J N Burgess, of the Conningham Sheep & Land company has announced that he will board every

hunter that shows up. Reports are coming in daily of the "nding of dens filled with pups and the bunters are reading rich rewards as well as enjoying good sport. Every coyote killed on many of the sheep ranges is worth \$2,50 to the killer, as most of the sheepmen are offering a bounty of \$1 in addition to that offer ed by the state.
