Mrs. Lydia M. Pike died April 23, 1909, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. G. W. Spencer, of Lakeview. Mrs. Pike was born in Ohio, Jan. 31st, 1834. She was married to Samuel Pike Sept. 26, 1851 and eight children were born to them. Four daughters and two sons survive her, viz: Mrs. W. G. Spencer, Lakeview; Mrs. Dora Cullen, Ashland; Mrs. Mary Patton, Goshen, Oregon; Mrs. John T. Fitzgerald, Warner Lake, Mr. A. J. Pike, Portland and Mr. W. T. Pike, Holt, California. She also has two sisters who survive her in Ohio.

The family came to Oregon in 1855, from Ohio and have been residents of the state ever since. Mr. Pike died at Grants, Pa. in 1895. Since then Mrs. Pike has lived with her two daughters in Lakeview.

Mrs. Pike was an early convert to the Quaker church, in which faith she lived a beautiful life.

As soon as Mr. and Mrs. Spencer recovered from their recent illness the remains will be moved to Grant's Pass to be laid by her husband.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. H. Smith, of New Pine Creek, from the Baptist church last Sunday. A large concourse of friends paid tribute to the last and rites.
