Ashland Tidings, 7: Ashland people who are interested in mining claims in the Tippy Wells Canyon district of Lake County, where the discovery of the reported "Lost Cabin" mines by Loftus Bros. a year or two ago occasioned considerable excitement have been hearing favorable reports from there recently.
