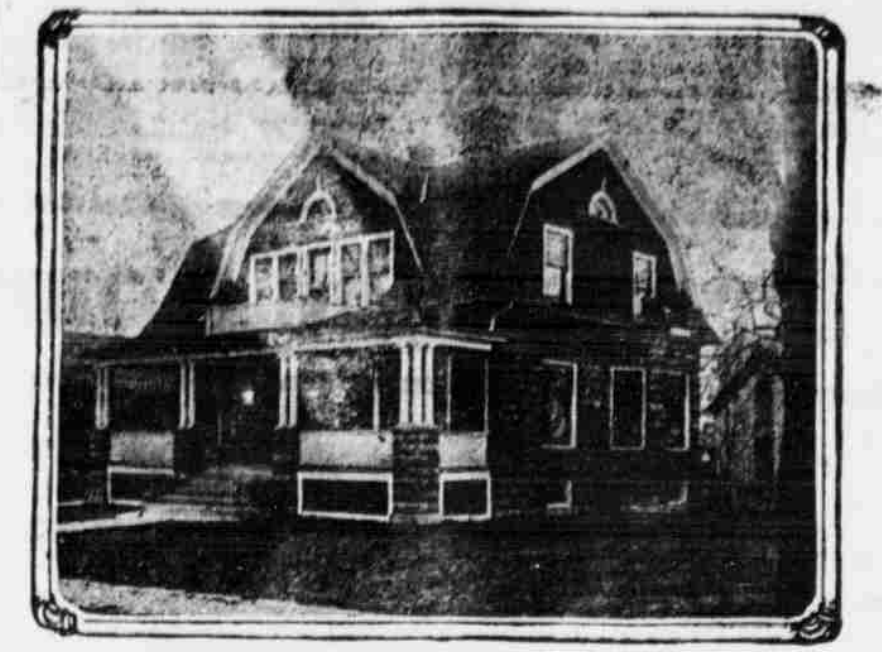

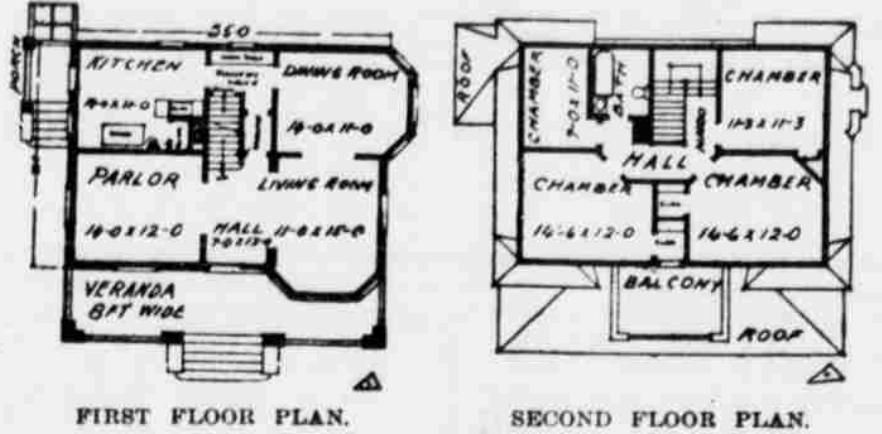
A Picturesque Concrete Residence.

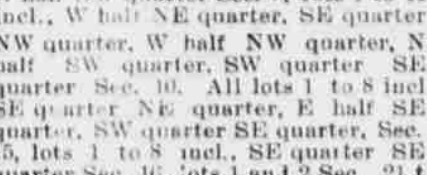

NOTICE OF RESTORATION OF PUBLIC LANDS TO SETTLEMENT AND ENTRY.
