# NEW STEAMER ON **GOOSE LAKE IS NEARLY COM-**PLETED

## View and Will Aid In Transportation **Facilities**

The new steamer of the Oregon Valley Land Co., that is soon to ply the waters of Goose Lake, is rapidly approaching completion. It is to be Will be Cut Up Into named the "Lake View."

The work of construction is in the hands of Wm. S. Brusstar, Jr., a noted boat builder of San Francisco. The boat is modeled on the same lines as the ferry boats plying on the waters of Golden Gate, except it is smaller. It has twin screws, with gasoline engines. It is 65 feet long. with 20 feet beam, and draws 4 feet Lakeview. The upper deck will have rows of chairs or seats for passengers. as will also the shade deck. The boat will have a large carrying capacity and will accommodate two hundred and fifty passengers. The cost will be upwards of \$20,000. The engines for the boat will each be 30 horse power, making a total of 60 horse power, making a total of 60 horse power, making a total of 60 horse power, which will enable the boat to break a three inch sheet of ice in winter. The engine room is in the center of the work, and the intricacy of the machinery made this a very interesting spot. The boat will be painted white. She will have french tevel glass windows on both sides 8 or 10 to a side, which will give passengers a full view of the changing panorama on either shore.
