### DIED

#### JOHN METZKER

John Metzker, a resident of this town for some years, and father of Wm. Metzker and James Metzker, grandfather of C. O. Metzker, late editor of the Examiner, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Julia Alder, at Troutdale near Portland, Aug. 28, at the age of 60 years.

Mr. Metzker was a pioneer of 1852, having been captain of a train of 100 wagons, which crossed the plains in that year. He settled first in Polk county Oregon, but moved to California in 1871, returning to Lakeview two years later, and lived here until the death of his wife, Mary Conner Metzker in 1876. Since then he has lived with his children here and elsewhere. He was born in Green Briar County, Virginia, in Sept. 23, 1849.

Eight children survive him. They are Mrs. Nancy Brown, Sherman, Mrs. Julia Alder, Portland; Mrs. Catherine Jones, Fossil; Mrs. Alice Hobbs, Cedarville, Calif.; Mrs. Luella Petree, Mrs. Jane Walter, of Portland; Wm. Metzker and James Metzker, of Lakeview.

Mr. Metzker was well respected and liked by all here. He left here last September, and considering his great age was then in good health and spirits.

**LENA FRANCES MALLOY**

This community was startled late Saturday afternoon by the announcement that Mrs. D. P. Malloy, one of the most estimable ladies of the town, had suddenly died.

Up to that day she had been the picture of health and strength and with years of promise before her. For four or five days her throat had bothered her, which developed into quincy. But neither she, husband, friends, nor doctor considered her in danger. Just a few moments before her death she had urged her husband to take their little son, to please him, to the hot springs for a bath. He had only arrived there when an auto was sent to notify him that his wife had died. It is supposed that the gathering broke, resulting in strangulation.

Mrs. Malloy was born in Klamath Falls in 1859, and was the daughter of Mrs. E. E. Hedrick. Some 7 or 8 years ago she came to Lakeview, and a year or so thereafter she was married to Mr. Malloy. The union resulted in two children, a little boy of four and a little girl of two years.

The funeral services were conducted at the home of the family Monday afternoon by Rev. Father O. Malley. The young clergyman is reported to have pronounced one of the most sympathetic and beautiful sermons ever delivered over the dead in Lakeview. He took his text from St. Luke 12th chapter and 11th verse.

The singing of Mrs. Norin was also tenderly rendered, and was appropriate to the solemn occasion.

Besides her two little ones and her husband the deceased leaves a sorrowing mother, two brothers and sisters. The latter are Mrs. Banks, Mrs. Anna Hedrick and Otto and Curtis Hedrick all of whom were here to attend the funeral.

In their deep loss Mr. Malloy and relatives have the heart felt sympathy of all.
