TABLE NAPKINS.

An Amusing History of This Very Indispensable Article.

Curiously enough, the table napkin, now deemed almost indispensable, was first used only by children and was adopted by elder members of the family only about the middle of the fifteenth century. In eliquette books of an earlier date, among other sage pieces of advice for children, are instructions about wiping their fingers and lips with their napkins.

It seems that the tablecloth was long enough to reach the floor and served the grown people in place of napkins. When they did begin to use napkins they placed them first on the shoulder, then on the left arm and finally tied them about the neck. A French writer, who evidently was conservative and did not welcome the napkin kindly, records with scorn:

"The napkin is placed under the chin and fastened in the back, as if one was going to be shaved. A person told me that he were his that way that he might not soil his beautiful frills."

It was a difficult matter to tle the two corners in the back, and it is said that thence originated our expression for straitened circumstances, "Hard to make both ends meet." This custom led to the habit shown by waiters of
