THE OLD CRIMES ARE STILL PUNISHED. MURDER IS PUNISHED. LARCENY IS PUNISHED. BURGLARY IS PUNISHED. BUT HOW ABOUT THOSE CRIMES WHICH ARE NOT PUNISHABLE UNDER EXISTING STATUTES? HOW ABOUT THE CRIMES OF MONEY LUST?

The manufacturer, for instance, who employs improper preservatives in food to save a few dollars—what shall we say of him? The effects of the preservatives upon the child's life may have never been adequately tested. It may kill the child. Is the manufacturer who makes use of such substances and assumes, perhaps unconsciously, the risk of killing a child to be looked upon as LESS GUILTY because his GUILT IS NOT SO OPEN as that of the thug who thrusts a knife between your shoulders in a dark alley? Are the railroad directors who TAKE A CHANCE AND PERMIT THEIR PASSENGERS TO BE KILLED not to be held to a moral accounting? It might seem shocking were I to call the man who had originated these devices which imperil human life a murderer. It is an ugly word indeed, and yet does it not in a measure seem applicable?

We have not yet in America reached the stage of development where we are ready to HOLD A MAN RESPONSIBLE FOR THOSE DEEDS WHICH HE DOES NOT ACTUALLY COMMIT WITH HIS HANDS, but this higher morality must and will be developed among us.

WE SHALL YET SEE THE DAY WHEN A MAN WILL NOT GO TO HIS LAWYER TO DISCOVER WHAT IS RIGHT AND WHAT IS WRONG; WHEN HE WILL LOOK WITHIN HIMSELF AND ANSWER THOSE SIMPLE QUESTIONS WITH A STURDY INTEGRITY.

Mrs. Pankhurst in America

The visit to New York of Mrs. Meline Pankhurst, leader of the militant English suffragettes, calls attention anew to the difference between American and British suffrage methods. Mrs. Pankhurst excuses the violence employed by her party on the ground that it is necessary to break the press boycott; that they could not get publicity without resorting to sensationalism, and without publicity they could not make their cause a vital issue. She says further that they acted on the advice of former Premier Balfour. It would be unkind to suggest that Mr. Balfour shrewdly advised this move to embarrass the Liberal government. Granting his good faith, was his counsel wise? It has resulted in sending a large number of leading Englishwomen to jail, but has it advanced the cause of suffrage? Whatever may be the answer as to England, it certainly is true that such violence would not have helped votes for women in America. Indeed, such a situation would have been impossible here.

Perhaps Mrs. Pankhurst's most telling point in her Carnegie hall address was her appeal to men. After recounting the battles men had fought to gain their rights she said, addressing men collectively, "What would you do in our place?" The question, of course, brought a storm of applause, but sober second thought dissipates its force. Right in Mrs. Pankhurst's own country of England manhood suffrage has been much extended in the past century and without such sensational and violent scenes as have attended the Pankhurst style of campaign. But even if men had used force, does it follow that woman should employ the same weapon? Can she not make her highest and most effective appeal in a more gentle and winning way?

The New York Independent thinks it is time from a halt in the warship and armament madnes of the nations of the earth, which is impoverishing all, and suggests that Theodore Roosevelt be called and commissioned to lead his evangel among the nations. It says:

He is the most distinguished and popular private citizen of the world, and is held in high repute by the rulers of other nations, especially the emperor of Germany, whose cooperation would be the most difficult to obtain. The first mention toward such an enterprise should be made by President Taft. Will he make it? Or would Roosevelt, who has martial instincts, consent?

To bring about such a consummation would be a far higher honor and would yield a far greater and enduring glory than to be president, king or emperor.

Cooperating with other western cities, Seattle and Tacoma have joined in the movement to persuade Theodore Roosevelt to return from his African hunting trip by the way of the Pacific coast. Several large newspapers have banded together to send a messenger to Khartoum in February to lay the matter before the former president. If he accepts large preparations will be made to give him an ovation as no home coming traveller has ever received. If he could be induced to land in the west, his "Return from Elba," would equal that of Napoleon by the Old Guard.

According to Bradstreet's Review, food prices are now higher than ever before known in December and the trend is still upward. Among the staples which increased in price within the last month are cereals, beef, mutton, hops, milk, bacon, lard, butter, cheese, mackerel, coffee, sugar, beans, petroleum paper and hay. There were decreases in eggs, tea, rice, peas, lemons, cotton and rubber.

Nineteen employees of the Delaware & Hudson Railroad shop were discharged because they weighed less than 150 pounds and it is expected that others under this weight will lose their positions soon. The weight limit is said to have been fixed owing to the idea that a mature man weighing less than 150 pounds does not possess the physical strength to do a normal man's work.

Nevada seems to have raised something else besides H-I, sage-brush, jack-rabbits and rattlesnakes in 1909. The mineral output was \$33,000,000 and the farm products—this it!

were \$33,000,000. The people who have been talking in a jeering and disrespectful way of the "pocket borough" should sit up and take notice. The "Sage Brush State" is surely coming into her own, and she is worthy!

In a way San Francisco has re-declared itself from the debasing thralldom of Calhoun ownership of its street railways. The voters of that city by a vote of 3 to 1 took its first step towards municipal ownership by taking over the Geary street railroad. They should not stop now until the whole system is in the people's hands. There is no one thing that is a greater breeder of graft and spoliation of the people than to have the public utilities in private hands. We hope and believe this move on the part of the people of San Francisco is a step towards government ownership of railroads that will sometime be duplicated all over the United States.

One of the speakers at the Washington Educational Association convention in Tacoma, recently declared that school teachers are the poorest paid of any of the train working class. This is attributed to the fact that they are so sympathetic to make any concerted effort to change their conditions. The speaker said he had sent interrogatories to 4,000 teachers on the subject and only 13 per cent of them replied. The answers received showed that many Washington teachers are obliged to supplement teaching with other work in order to make living.

Our Franchise End and other up-state exchanges in Central Oregon begin to feel the rushing of railroads towards their towns, and are blossoming out with full page ads, and other evidences of new life in their communities. Lakeview has not reached that stage in business life yet, but it is coming in the near future.
