More or less pruning or other care is necessary every year, either to promote health and vigor, remove dead wood or to induce desirable changes in form or growth, but such work should never be done except by expert tree men. As has been often said in these columns, every kind of tree must be treated in accordance with the needs of the particular kind; the elms have their peculiarities, the oaks their, and so on, and only men with a thorough knowledge of these conditions should ever be permitted to prune a tree. In all communities where it is possible such work should be done under the directions of a city forester.
