An Interesting Decision

C. W. Davis the real estate man, made a contract with the owner for land in Villa Hill, agreeing to pay \$100 down as purchases were made, so that he could give title. A man to whom he sold failed to keep up his payments, and the Mansfield company holding the assigned claim of Davis, sued to foreclose. Judge Morrow holds that the foreclosure cannot be made until the man who owes is in position to give absolute title. As most new tracts are sold under this method, real estate men will be put in a bad position if the purchasers refuse to pay the absolute title to the property as passed.

Cold Weather Pendleton

PENDLETON, Or., Feb. 1.—This section of Eastern Oregon is in the grip of zero weather again. The ground is covered with snow and if the cold weather continues it will mean great expense and possible loss to stockmen. Feed is high and hard to get at any price. According to reports received this evening from the John Day country in Grant County the hay supply is exhausted and cattle can be purchased at \$5 a head. It is said that they are already too weak to be driven out to where feed can be obtained. It is clear tonight, a strong wind is blowing from the north, and there is every indication that the temperature will go below zero before morning.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Feb. 4.—Frederick Weyerhaeuser, the St. Paul lumber king, reputed to be the world's wealthiest man, announced this morning that he intended to retire from active participation in many enterprises with which he is connected. He has already withdrawn from the directorate of the First National bank of Chippewa Falls, Wis., and will withdraw from seven or eight banks and the several mutual insurance companies of which he is now a director.

He will still supervise his lumber interests, but he said this morning that he intends to leave the details to his son, Frederick E. Weyerhaeuser. He is 75 years old.
