How to Blow a Nose Scientifically. Medical experts are calling the attention of the public to the Importance of performing the nose blowing operation in a scientific and hygienic manner, First one nostril and then the other should be blown with ut undue violence. Doctors state that the two nasal passages should never be closed at the same time. If they are obstructed, as in the case of a cold, the back of the throat is filled with compressed air, and this, together with the discharge and the microbes which it contains, may be driven through the eustachlan tube into the middle ear and his patients to blow their noses when gon suffering from a cold. This course is hardly one which will commend itself 1910. to those in the habit of catching colds. The best advice would seem to be that the blowing should be done gently.

How to Make Cheese Straws.

To make cheese straws put two ounces of flour into a basin, with a good seasoning of salt and cayenne. add to these two ounces of grated Par mesan cheese. When these are mixed together rub into them lightly two ounces of butter, then mix the whole an egg and a little water if necessary Roll out the pastry till it is an eighth of an inch thick. and three or four inches long. Lay these on a balling tin (which need not be greased) and bake them in a slow oven until they are a delicate brown. These straws require very gentle handling, as they break so easily.

How to Roast Meat,

Put the roast in the pan free from seasoning and flour. When sufficiently cooked pour off every particle of spoonfuls of flour into the brown subover this one plnt of cold water, put ver the fire and cook until it thickens, stirring constantly to prevent lumping. Season with salt and pepper chicken gravy a half cup of rich cream is a great addition. Gravies made thus are free from grease, which is so harmful to delicate stomachs.
