The Great Northern Railway will exploit Central Oregon, and has sent two men through that territory to get data for bulletins and other railroad publications that will describe the country thoroughly to the prospective settlers who they may expect there. The Valley to the Deschutes River tributary to the Hill road now building up the Deschutes will come in for much more favorable publicity and its resources, crop possibilities and general future will be told. The Hill lines are taking an interest in Oregon that will mean much for the state. At exhibit rooms in St. Paul, the Great Northern shows Oregon products and similar exhibit are to be maintained by the railroad company in Philadelphia and Boston. These places will direct a great deal of attention to the opportunities in Central Oregon for the settler.
