

NEW DISCOVERY AT FORT BIDWELL

Gold Found in an Abandoned Mine in the Hoag District

Fort Bidwell, Cal. March 12.—A mining strike was made close to the town of Fort Bidwell in a neglected part of the Hoag mining district in an old abandoned mine on the south side of Mount Bidwell. The ground was first located and worked twenty-eight years ago, and from time to time since then the ground has been relocated and worked, but no sensational finds were made until now.
The new discovery was made on the surface of the ground above the old workings of J. O. Kafater, E. L. Kafater and John Wall. The ledge is between three and four feet wide, and will run as high as \$42 a ton in gold and silver. A force of men has been put to work to determine the extent of the ore body.
