Mining Notes.

The Alturas Plaindealer of the 15th inst, has this bit of mining news: Charles Everson left Wednesday for his mine near Quinn River, Nevada. Mr. Everson informs us that a quantity of ore from their mine sent east for a mill test gave a return of about \$100 per ton. As the ledge is large and well defined he thinks he has a genuine bonanza out there. An eastern company is going to take charge of the property and will install machinery for working the ore, an abundance of water power for generating electricity being near. We surely hope Mr Everson will realize to the fullest extent his sanguine expectations.

M. Huttie while here this week informed us that Jas. Harvey leasee of the Hess mine below Cooby, will shortly go below to purchase new machinery to work the ore. Development work has progressed far enough to justify the outlay. The little old fashioned stamp mill is saving about \$85 per day, and Mr. Harvey figures that modern machinery will make the mine a big paying proposition. Five claims adjoining has been bonded by capital, and development work will begin at once.

R. L. Mason returned Saturday evening from a winters sojourn in the lower country and Monday went on to Bidwell. Mr. Mason during the winter visited many of the great mines of California and says he returned better satisfied than ever with the Hong mines He extended his trip to old Mexico and went through several mines down there. The principal object of his visit to the mines of this state was to study the methods of mining as practiced by modern engineers and mining men, and says his time was well spent. Mr. Mason predicts a great future for the Hoaz district, and says that a number of capitalists and mining men will be in as soon as spring opens.
