The Government Acts Against Bleaching of Flour

TO MANUFACTURERS, VENDORS, AND CONSUMERS OF BLEACHED FLOUR: Flour bleached by the Alop process contains added poisonous and acrid deleterious ingredients which render the flour injurious to health. Flour bleached by the Alop process contains a substance known as nitrites, which reduces, lowers and injuriously affects the quality and strength of the flour. Flour bleached by the Alop process is mixed, colored and stained in a manner whereby damage and inferiority are concealed. For these reasons flour bleached by the Alop process is adulterated with the meaning of the Food and Drugs Act of June 30, 1906. So decided Judge Rufus E. Foster on March 15, 1910, in the case of the United States of America, Libellant, v. 429 sacks, et al. of Flour, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana. There was also involved in this case the issue of misbranding, and the decree of the court was that the flour was unbranded. Your attention is called, particularly, however, to the adulteration feature because of the misleading circular which is being distributed by the Alop Process Company in an effort to induce manufacturers of flour to continue to violate the Food and Drugs Act. An attorney of the Alop Process Company who also represented several of the millers, and other attorneys representing the millers, had a full, fair opportunity in the New Orleans case to contest the issue of adulteration of flour bleached by the Alop Process and refused to do so. The so-called "Iowa cases" were dismissed by the Government because in the opinion of the Assistant Attorney General in charge of the case the issue was not presented in those cases in the full, complete and thorough manner desired by the Government. I desire to advise manufacturers, vendors, and consumers of bleached flour that there has been no change in the position of this Department as announced in Food Inspection Decision No. 100, and sustained by the Federal Court, i. e., flour bleached by nitrogen peroxid is an adulterated product under the Food and Drugs Act of June 30, 1906; the character of the adulteration is such that no statement upon the label will bring bleached flour within the law; and that such flour can not legally be made or sold in the District of Columbia or in the Territories or be transported or sold in interstate commerce.
