WITHDRAWALS ARE TO BE LEGALIZED

WASHINGTON, April 8.—A favorable report on the Administration conservation measure, introduced by Representative Pickens of Iowa, authorizing the President to withdraw public lands, was ordered by the House Committee on Public Lands by a party vote yesterday. The bill would prescribe that after withdrawal the lands may be classified as to character and value and restored to entry.

Democratic members contended withdrawals made by former President Roosevelt and President Taft were unauthorized by law, and they unsuccessfully opposed a bill which ratified and confirmed all the withdrawals heretofore made and now existing.
