Among the Paris buildings soon to be demolished is the Castle of Etoiles, on the Seine. It was the favorite domicile of Louis XIV.


The French government has begun its first coinage of aluminium fractional currency, to take the place of the old copper coins, which will be withdrawn from cirulation.
