In the matter of the petition of J. Hotchkiss and others for the purpose of laying out and establishing a County Road.
This matter having been continued until this time and the same having been thoroughly considered by the Court and the Court being fully advised in the premises and that that the said petition does not conform to the requirements of the law so as to give this Court jurisdiction in the premises.

In the matter of the appointment of a secretary of the County Board of Health of Lake County, Oregon; the said secretary being the Health Officer for said County; It is hereby ordered that Dr. T. V. Hall be and he is hereby appointed to succeed himself as secretary of the Board of Health of Lake County, Oregon and also Health Officer for the said County, for the term provided by law for the appointment of such officers.

After finishing the examination of the books of the Sheriff and Clerk, Court adjourned to meet Friday, May 6, 1910 at 9 o'clock A. M.

In the matter of the application of D. R. Jones and Fred Hughes, partners doing business under the style and firm name of Jones & Hughes, for a license to sell spirituous, malt and vinous liquors, and fermented ciders, commonly known as hard cider, in less quantities than one gallon at the town of Plush, in North Warner Precinct, Lake County, Oregon, for the period of six months, from May 7th, 1910.

This matter coming on regularly to be heard at this time and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Jones & Hughes, co-partners, have complied with the law in all particulars, as in such cases required, it is therefore, hereby ordered that the Clerk of this Court issue a license to the said Jones & Hughes to sell spirituous, malt and vinous liquors, and fermented ciders, commonly known as hard cider, in less quantities than one gallon, at the town of Plush, in North Warner Precinct, Lake County, Oregon, for a period of six months from May 7, 1910.

In the matter of county roads: Complaints having been made to the County Court that several of the Road Supervisors of the county have neglected to put the public roads, in their respective road districts in good condition, and as a result the traveling public are inconvenienced by such neglect of duty of the said Road Supervisors.

In order that there can be no misunderstanding as to the position of the County Court in reference to the construction and maintenance of good roads for Lake County it is hereby ordered that it shall be the duty of each Road Supervisor in Lake County, Oregon, to make a personal examination of every bridge and culvert in his district, and to immediately repair or rebuild every bridge or culvert that requires to be repaired or rebuilt; that it shall be the duty of each Road Supervisor to put the public roads, especially the principle traveled roads, in good condition for public travel; that it shall be the duty of each Road Supervisor to consult, with the County Court from time to time, in reference to the work to be done in his district in touch as to the work being done in order that the Court may keep in touch and also the amount of money that is being expended in each Road District of the county.

The County Court, therefore, earnestly requests that each Road Supervisor shall cooperate with the Court in an effort to construct and maintain good public roads for the convenience of the people in Lake County.

It is further ordered that the County Clerk furnish copy of this order to each Road Supervisor of the County.
