Because he took part in the passage of an ordinance prohibiting cows to run at large on the streets of the town of which he is the chief executive, was the cause of Mayor M. O. Hawkins of Coquille, the county seat of Coos county, being defeated for reelection. J. R. Quick the Socialist candidate, has been elected mayor of Coquille, although all the other candidates on the Socialist ticket were badly beaten.

An unofficial report from Washington states that Charles W. Fairbanks, formerly vice president of the United States, will succeed William Reid as ambassador at the court of St. James. The report is generally credited there, though Fairbanks refuses to issue confirmation or denial.

A bill providing for the opening to agricultural settlement and development of the surface of lands classified as coal lands was passed by the House May 12th. The measure would reserve about 70,000,000 acres as coal lands to be worked on the surface for the purpose of agriculture.
