HILL TRIUMPHANT OVER HIS OPPONENT

Harriman Interests to Use Oregon Trunk Track in Canyon

Harriman interests have again made terms with Hill in the fight for supremacy in Central Oregon. The rival interests have just closed up an arrangement whereby the Deschutes Railway will use 37 miles of the Oregon Trunk Line's road.

Under this contract the Oregon Trunk will complete its line on the west side of the canyon from the Columbia River south into Central Oregon, on its present line. It will retain sole ownership of its entire right-of-way along the east side of the canyon from the Columbia River south for 50 miles, covering the sections in the lower canyon, where the original conflict was located.

Rapidly Settling Up

The Harriman line spent two years on a railroad survey across Eastern Oregon and this line reaches from one end of the valley to the other and is probably the best railroad grade in Oregon considering the distance the line will run, the maximum grade established being two-thirds of one percent.

High School Site Chosen

At the special school election, held on the 15th inst., the Sherklock property was unanimously chosen for the new high school site, and the action of the School Board in purchasing the property approved.

The Deschutes Company also conveys to the Oregon Trunk, at cost, the necessary right of way for the line of the latter through what is known as the Smith ranch and also through all lands which it may have acquired between this point and the mouth of Trout Creek.

The general operation, including maintenance of the line used jointly, is to be under the control and supervision of the Oregon Trunk, and the cost of the maintenance is to be divided upon a wheelage basis.

R. R. Surveyors at Bieber

C. W. Brown, assistant engineer with the corps of surveyors now in the canyon south of this valley, was in Bieber Monday. While Mr. Brown gave out no information in regard to where the survey would run through this valley, it can be stated that the present survey is being made on the east side of the river, and that a camp in the lower end of the valley will be made on the east side of the stream.
