ANSWERS LAST CALL

ALBERT WALKER, OF BLY, PASSES ON

Succumbs to Attack of Heart Failure--Laid to Rest at Ashland

Klamath Chronicle: County Commissioner William Albert Walker died in a hospital in Portland Wednesday evening about 8:30, heart failure being the cause of death.

Mr. Walker has been suffering from heart trouble for some months, but only at intervals. He was apparently robust and healthy but at times for a few days, or possibly only hours he would suffer intensely and have sinking spells.

Mr. Walker received a telegram from his father stating that he reached Portland and was feeling much better. Mr. Walker's friends feared that he would have a hard time making the trip in the condition his heart was in...

Following this telegram came the one last night stating that Mr. Walker had suddenly passed away and this news came as a shock to almost every person in the county as every body who has been here any length of time knew the commissioner.

Mr. Walker was born in Iowa 51 years ago and came to the Klamath country during the '70s when but a young man. He was married to Miss Witt, a sister of John E. Witt, who is superintendent of the county poor farm.

Mr. Walker is probably one of the best known stockmen and farmers in Klamath county. By frugality and thrift he has accumulated many acres of meadow and stock land in the Sprague river country, about 40 miles east of here.

The remains will be brought back to Ashland, where they will be interred by the side of his parents who died in Jackson County a few years ago. Mr. Walker has a brother, Butler Walker, but his whereabouts cannot be learned.

Irishmen Clash

Many of the Irish boys living in Lake county are from county Cork and the following dispatch from Newmarket under the date of May 27 will no doubt prove interesting to them:

One man is dead, a dozen are seriously wounded while several hundred persons are nursing bruises today as the result of the most violent clash that has yet occurred between the Irish followers of William O'Brien leader of the United Irish League, and John Redmond, head of the Irish Nationalists.

The fight took place last night and resulted from an attempt of a Redmondite to address the meeting here, this town being an O'Brien stronghold. The fight waged so bitterly that the police finally fired on the mob, killing one of the belligerents and wounding several.

Many houses were badly damaged in the melee. Clubs, fists and stones were the chief weapons used, and cracked heads were the order of the night. After the police finally dispersed the mob, they staid on guard throughout the night.

Redmond is severely blamed for planning a speaking tour among O'Brien's constituency. Further trouble is expected.
