City Park Needed

The proposition of securing ground suitable for city park purposes is now being considered. The question is a timely one, and should certainly be favorably considered by the city. H. W. Drenkel has offered a block of land in the Sherlock addition, and it is possible there are other sites that could be had. Be this as it may, one thing is certain, and that is that no further time should elapse before securing grounds for park purposes in some part of the city. The block offered by Mr. Drenkel is 355x316 feet, containing about three acres. This will be exclusive of the streets surrounding the block, which Mr. Drenkel proposes to grade and gravel, and the price, \$1350, is considered reasonable. The property is located two blocks south of the High School site and at present is occupied by the large barn belonging to C. E. Sherlock.

V. L. Snelling is taking much interest in the matter, and has already interested the ladies to the extent that they have agreed to undertake the planting of trees and care of the proposed park if the city or some philanthropic citizens will secure the grounds and fence them.
