Talk of big Auto Race

W. L. Capp claims the record for an auto between here and Klamath Falls, the actual elapsed time between leaving and arriving being five hours and 20 minutes. Mr. Clapp is authority for the statement that every effort is being made to pull off a big race from Lakeview to Klamath Falls on the Fourth between H. P.
